# **Community Arts Center Update**



The excitement for the Old Bank Building on Blackhorse Pike is ongoing as the Phase 2 work is getting underway. Phase 1 work is nearly finished with just a few punch list items to complete. The new entrance is similar to the old original entrance built over 100

years ago with an inviting stair, large columns and oversized wood doors. Exterior work on the stone and restoration of the crown molding have been completed. On the interior, completed ADA work includes the handicap lift and bathrooms.

A Phase 2 kick-off meeting was recently held on site. Most of the Phase 2 work will include the fit-out of the interior spaces of the Old Bank Building to convert it to a multi-purpose Community Center. The interior stone walls will be



furred in order to add insulation to meet the current energy codes. New base, crown and wainscot moldings will be added to the new furred out walls to enhance the look and feel of the space.

The old bank vault will remain in place and be converted to a small concession stand as needed for certain events. We will install casework, a refrigerator and a hand sink as necessary. The vault door which is over 500 pounds will remain. The rust will be removed and will be cleaned up as much as possible.

Up at the ceiling, a theater pipe rail system will be installed for lighting and sound systems. In an effort to cover some of the roof rafters, a suspended cloud ceiling system will be installed between the pipe rail system.

New flooring will be installed throughout to complete the finishes for the space. We know a lot of local residents have visited the building over the years and we are anticipating the new space will not disappoint.

We are working toward a final construction completion date in August. We hope to see you at the ribbon cutting ceremony or at an event held at the building in the fall.

SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

In accordance with our NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit, the Twp. adopted various Ordinances to regulate the impact of stormwater runoff and pollutants on the environment.

**1. Pet Waste**: This requires pet owners to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property. It prevents fecal contamination from impacting the local waterways.

**2. Litter:** This states it is unlawful to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place litter of any nature upon any public or private property, other than in a litter receptacle. This prevents unsightly & unsanitary conditions & prevent litter from impacting waterways.

**3. Improper Disposal of Waste:** This states that it is illegal to dispose of waste in any place not specifically designated for the purpose of solid waste storage or disposal. The purpose is to prevents unsanitary conditions and groundwater pollution.

**4. Wildlife Feeding:** Feeding of water fowl on municipal park property is prohibited by Ordinance. The Township enacted the Ordinance as a method to reduce water fowl population in response to health concerns regarding bacteria which is harmful to humans and fish populations.

**5. Yard Waste:** Yard waste is regulated by Ordinance which establishes the current zone collection system and the methods of collecting leaves, brush, and other yard waste. The purpose is to keep leaves and grass out of the storm sewer system.

**6. Illicit Connections:** This makes it unlawful to connect any pipe or device to the municipal storm sewer system that is intended to discard, spill or dump any material other than stormwater runoff or ground water (sump pumps) into the system. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prevent pollution and contamination of waterways which receive discharge from our storm sewers.

The transport of pollutants into local water bodies destroys fish, wildlife and habitats; threatens public health and causes the loss of recreational and aesthetic value. We have enacted these Ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by stormwater from adversely impacting our waterways and groundwater supplies.

This decision follows at the recommendation of the Gloucester Township Police Department, who was made aware of social media post comments that threaten potential lawless behavior during the event. In light of the unruliness and violence experienced at the end of the 2024 Gloucester Township Day event, the safety and well-being of our residents, families, and visitors remain our top priority.

Mayor David Mayer stated, "Gloucester Township Day is a beloved tradition that brings our community together in celebration. However, we must take all potential threats seriously. Out of an abundance of caution and with the safety of all in mind, we are postponing this year's event until a later date."

Gloucester Township Police Chief David Harkins added, "Our department was made aware of disturbing com-

ments made following a Gloucester Township Instagram posting on March 9, 2025, regarding Gloucester Township Day. The posting was copied and used on other social media platforms, where it saw unusually high activity, which included threats of lawless and violent activity at the 2025 Gloucester Township Day event. We take the safety of our Gloucester Township community very seriously, and it is for these credible reasons that I recommended that the event be postponed."
