Gloucester Township proudly welcomed Circle S: Second Chance Ranch Foundation with a ribbon cutting ceremony at their farm. Mayor David R. Founded by Hilary, who is over 14 years sober, and her husband Kevin, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran, Circle S was born from their shared journey of healing and second chances. What began with the rescue of a horse just before slaughter has grown into a nonprofit dedicated to equine-assisted therapy—offering hope, connection, and purpose to both animals and people, especially veterans and first responders coping with PTSD.

To launch their new Equine Assisted Therapy Program, Circle S will host an Open House on July 19th from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM for veterans and first responders. Guests are invited to meet the horses, tour the farm, and learn how this unique program helps build healing through connection.


DIAMOND CPR & SAFETY OPENS IN GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP



With the Catalina Hills Complex now complete, it stands as a testament to Gloucester Township's ongoing commitment to enhancing quality of life through parks, play, and active living.




