New Ordinance Passed!

COMMUNITY SOLAR

In response to recent announcements of rate increases from PSE&G and Atlantic City Electric, Gloucester Township is encouraging residents to take advantage of New Jersey's Community Solar Energy Program — an optional initiative that can help lower household electricity costs without the need to install solar panels on a resident's own home.

Through the state program, residents can subscribe to a share of discounted solar electricity generated by local commercial solar projects developed by Solar Landscape, a New Jersey-headquartered company. Subscribers will receive a guaranteed minimum 15% discount on the value of solar credits applied to their electric bills, helping to offset rising utility rates.

After a resident's assigned project is energized, within one to three billing cycles the savings will begin appearing on their electric bills — estimated to start this winter and continue throughout 2026. The discount rate is guaranteed for 20 years, and residents remain customers of their current utility.

Program highlights include:

- No rooftop panels, no fees to enroll, and no long-term commitments
- Guaranteed at least 15% discount on solar credits for 20 years
- Available in addition to any state or federal energy assistance
- Priority enrollment for low- to moderate-income households
- · First-come, first-served availability

Saturday Drop-Off Hours at Public Works

The Public Works facility will be open on Saturdays, September 6th through November 22nd, from 8am-2pm for residential recycling drop off. This will be for brush, oil, white goods, electronics, metals, concrete, and car batteries. We do not accept paint or trash.

Bagged Grass Clippings and **Bagged Leaves**

GTPW collects leaves according to the fall leaf schedule. A second pick up will start after the first round is complete, weather permitting. Residents are reminded to rake their leaves curbside, NOT IN THE STREET, only during the fall leaf schedule which ends 12/31. After this time all leaves must be bagged.

BRUSH PICKUP

As per Township Ordinance, branches, hedge trimmings, light brush clippings, etc. must be securely tied into **four foot (4') bundles** that can be easily handled and the diameter of any branch may not exceed six inches (6"). The bundles shall not exceed **fifty (50) pounds** in weight. Public Works will pick up bundles on your designated day only if the ordinance is followed.

During storm damage, we will work with residents to pick up their brush, however the ordinance must be followed. No commercial vehicles can dump at Public Works. For questions on brush pick-up please call Public Works at 856-228-3144.

Please separate your grass from yard debris, sticks, trash, etc or it will not be picked up by the GT Recycling Center To contact them please call 856-227-5665.

White Goods and Electronics Recycling Pick-Up



Public Works now picks up white goods: refrigerators, air conditioners, ranges, washers, dryers and hot water heaters. We also recycle electronics including TVs. Please call PW at 856-228-3144 for items to be picked up on Wednesdays.



Stormwater Management

The Township adopted various ordinances to regulate the impact of stormwater runoff and pollutants on the environment. The transport of pollutants into local water bodies destroys fish, wildlife and habitats; threatens public health and causes the loss of recreational and aesthetic value. We have enacted these ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by stormwater from adversely impacting our waterways and groundwater supplies. The GTPD has a Safe Exchange Zone inside and outside our department. The inside location is located between the watch desk area and the courtroom, and the outside location is located by the front steps of the Police Department.

This Save Exchange Zone should be used for such things as custody exchanges and online purchase exchanges. This is a safe, well-lit area that is recording and open 24 hours a day to help improve your safety during these transactions. Additional safety precautions:

- We want to encourage you to meet at our police station.
- Our police station is open 24 hours a day, but we want to encourage you not to do transactions at night.
- Never meet in a secluded area.
- Never invite strangers to your home, or go to a stranger's house.
- Use your instincts. If a deal is too good to be true, it probably is.
- Always be cautious when purchasing/ selling a high-priced item.

The Gloucester Township Police Department Chapter of the "Public Safety Alliance For Individuals With Disabilities" A.I.D. program (formerly known as the Special Needs Program) is a voluntary service open to all citizens.

The program was created to help police officers and other emergency service personnel to better assist residents with disabilities or special needs in the event of an emergency by providing those first responders with vital information regarding a participant's disability, emergency contact information, a physical description, and a current photograph of the registrant. The goal of the A.I.D. The program is to ensure all residents who have a disability or special need are able to get the help and support they need in a time of emergency or during interaction with Law Enforcement, Fire, or EMS personnel.

GTPD Steering Wheel Locks

Gloucester Township Police offers free steering wheel locks for our Gloucester Township, New Jersey residents who own a Kia or Hyundai that has been affected by the vulnerability in their ignition system, which allows car thieves to start the vehicle using a USB device or cord.

This bright yellow device attaches to your steering wheel, which will hopefully deter a car thief from breaking the window, and is available whether you received the anti-theft update from your dealer or not. Gloucester Township Police and police across the country have seen multiple auto theft incidents involving these specific car brands. The car thieves are taking advantage of a vulnerability in the ignition system, allowing them to start the vehicle using a USB device or cord. If the vehicle is locked, they will break a rear window to gain access.

As always: LOCK your vehicle, REMOVE the key or remote key, and valuables from the vehicle.

Would you like to learn more about the Gloucester Township Police Department? The Gloucester Township Police Department, in a continuing effort to foster an even better police community partnership, would like to invite any Gloucester Township resident 16 years of age or older to attend the Citizens Police Academy.

The Gloucester Township Police Department Citizens Police Academy is a free 14-week course that begins in January each year. The classes will be on Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:30PM. The course will include an overview of the police department and the administration, police communications, special operations, criminal investigations, traffic safety, K9, Special Response Team, Crime Scene Unit, and much more. Also, all attendees of the Citizen Police Academy will be trained in the use of CPR for the home.

The objective of the Citizen Police Academy is not to train an individual to be a Police Officer but to produce informed citizens. The Citizens and Police Officers meet each other face to face in a neutral, friendly setting, and each becomes a person to the other. In the past, citizens have simply seen a uniform; now they have an understanding of the person behind the badge. Through your participation in the Citizens Police Academy program, you are promoting community involvement, which in itself is the most powerful force any law enforcement agency has in the fight against crime.

This is also the first step as a community partner, and those who may be interested in becoming a Gloucester Township Police Volunteer.

Join or Start a Neighborhood Watch

WHAT IS IT?



A Neighborhood Watch is neighbors helping neighbors. They are extra eyes and ears for reporting crime and helping neighbors. Members meet their neighbors, learn how to make their homes more secure, watch out for each other and the neighborhood, and report activity that raises their suspicions to the police or sheriff's office. Neighborhood Watch, Block Watch, Town Watch, Building Watch, Crime

Watch – whatever the name, it's one of the most effective and least costly ways to prevent crime and reduce fear. Neighborhood Watch fights the isolation that crime both creates and feeds upon. It forges bonds among area residents, helps reduces burglaries and robberies, and improves relations between police and the communities they serve.

WHY NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH?

- It works. Throughout the country, dramatic decreases in burglary and related offenses are reported by law enforcement professionals in communities with active Watch programs.
- Today's transient society produces communities that are less personal. Many families have two working parents and children involved in many activities keeping them away from home. An empty house in a neighborhood where none of the neighbors know the owner is a prime target for burglary. Neighborhood Watch also helps build pride and serves as a springboard for efforts that address other community concerns such as recreation for youth, child care, and affordable housing.

HOW DOES A NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH START?

A motivated individual, a few concerned residents, a community organization, or a law enforcement agency can spearhead the efforts to establish a Watch. Together they can:

- Organize a small planning committee of neighbors to discuss needs, the level of interest, and possible community problems.
- Contact the GTPD Community Relations Bureau for information on setting up an initial meeting.
- Start asking around, by word of mouth, phone or Social Media, to gauge neighbors' interest; establish the purpose of the program; and begin to identify issues that need to be addressed.
- Select a coordinator.
- Recruit members, keeping up-to-date information on new residents and making special efforts to involve the elderly, working parents, and young people.
- Work with local government or law enforcement to put up Neighborhood Watch signs, usually after at least 50 percent of all households are enrolled.

Traffic Safety Around School Buses and Bus Stops

As the school year is upon us, the Gloucester Township Police Department Traffic Safety Unit (TSU) reminds residents to prioritize traffic safety, especially around school buses and bus stops. Ensuring the safety of our children requires vigilance from everyone. School buses are among the safest modes of transportation, but their safety depends on drivers following key rules:

- Stop for School Buses: When a school bus is stopped with its red lights flashing and stop arm extended, all traffic in both directions must stop, unless separated by a physical barrier like a median. Passing a stopped school bus is illegal and endangers children.
- Bus Stop Awareness: Be cautious near bus stops. Children may cross streets unexpectedly or be less visible during early morning or evening hours. Slow down and stay alert in these areas.
- Obey School Zone Speed Limits: Reduced speed limits in school zones are strictly enforced to protect students walking or biking to school.

Enhanced Enforcement by Gloucester Township Police TSU

The Gloucester Township Police Department TSU is intensifying efforts to address unsafe driving behaviors. Officers will target infractions such as speeding and distracted driving in school zones and near bus stops. These violations pose significant risks to students and other pedestrians. Expect increased patrols and strict enforcement to ensure compliance with traffic laws.

To further enhance roadway safety, the Traffic Safety Unit is collaborating with neighboring police departments to conduct targeted enforcement operations along Berlin Cross Keys Road. This initiative will be based on historical crash data and aims to reduce the frequency of motor vehicle crashes in this high-traffic area. Officers will utilize both marked and unmarked patrols to address distracted driving and aggressive driving behaviors, such as tailgating, improper lane changes, and excessive speeding, which are leading contributors to crashes. This cooperative effort underscores our commitment to making our roads safer for all users.

Radar Feedback Speed Signs

The Traffic Safety Unit has identified and used verifiable data collection methods to confirm various streets that tend to have higher instances of speeding. As a result, radar feedback speed signs have been installed in these areas to alert motorists when they exceed the speed limit. Consider these signs a warning: officers will continue speed enforcement operations on these roadways, and violators will be held accountable. Stay mindful of your speed to avoid citations and keep our community safe.

A Shared Responsibility

Lastly, traffic safety is a collective effort. Whether you're a motorist, pedestrian, or cyclist, we all play a role in creating a safer Gloucester Township. Drivers must obey traffic laws, pedestrians should use crosswalks and stay visible, and cyclists need to follow road rules. By policing ourselves and holding each other accountable, we can reduce accidents and protect our community's most vulnerable members.

Let's work together to ensure our streets are safe for everyone, especially our children. If you have concerns about traffic safety or suggestions for improvement, contact the Gloucester Township Police Department, Traffic Safety Unit. Together, we can make our township a safer place to live.
