Downtown Blackwood Section of Gloucester Township Enters an Exciting New Phase



Downtown Blackwood section of Gloucester Township continues to thrive as revitalization efforts transform the area into a vibrant arts and cultural district. The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) will soon begin the Black Horse Pike Resurfacing Project, featuring new paving, decorative lighting, upgraded traffic signals, and modernized guiderails.

Construction is expected to begin in early 2026 and will align with Gloucester Township's Streetscaping Project, further enhancing safety, accessibility, and curb appeal in the downtown area. These coordinated improvements will help drive economic growth, increase foot traffic, and strengthen community connection.

"Downtown Blackwood's transformation reflects our ongoing commitment to economic revitalization and community development," said Mayor David R. Mayer. Try to keep all leaves unbagged at curbside. If you must use bags, **please use paper bags only.**

Rake all leaves curbside. Do not rake leaves into the street if it

will block traffic.

Do not mix trash and broken branches with leaves. This clogs the machines and your leaves will not be picked up.

Do not park any vehicles in front of leaves during your pick-up week. **They will not be picked up.**
