Gloucester Township Elementary School Celebrates 100 Years

Mayor David R. Mayer presented a proclamation to Gloucester Township Elementary School in honor of its 100th anniversary during the school's annual Americanism Show.

Originally constructed in 1925 and opened in 1926 as Blackwood Junior School, the historic building has stood for nearly a century as a pillar of education in our community. While the interior has evolved to meet the changing needs of students, the school's legacy of excellence, tradition, and neighborhood pride has remained constant.

Throughout its distinguished history, Gloucester Township Elementary School has educated generations of families and earned national recognition for its outstanding Americanism Program, including the prestigious George Washington Honor Medal and the AMVETS Silver Helmet Americanism Trophy.

Today, the school continues to serve students in Kindergarten through Grade Five, providing a nurturing and high-achieving environment supported by dedicated educators and families. Gloucester Township Recreation Department Preschool

Serving Gloucester Township and surrounding communities for over 40 years, our Preschool Program provides families with an affordable, high-quality early childhood education experience.

Classes are held part-time, four days per week (Monday–Thursday).
Children are grouped based on the year they will enter Kindergarten.

Program Eligibility

4-Year-Old Program: Child must turn 4 by September 30

3-Year-Old Program: Children may begin any session pending openings:

- Fall Session: Child must turn 3 by September 30
- Winter Session: Child must turn 3 by December 15
- Spring Session: Child must turn 3 by March 1

Cost of Program

Resident Fees:

\$215/session (Fall, Winter, Spring) or \$645/full year

Non-Resident Fees:

\$260/session (Fall, Winter, Spring) or \$780/full year
