ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER CREATING CHAPTER 65 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER ENTITLED NOISE ORDINANCE

Mr. Mercado stated that the Council has been working on this ordinance since July of 2016. He stated that they have had the Camden County health Department at the meetings as well as residents. He stated before the public hearing, he would like to clarify a few things. He stated that the GTPD will not come after you while you are cutting your grass because of the noise of the mower. He stated that this ordinance adds relief to some neighborhoods and it is a quality of life initiative.

Mr. Mercado opened the public hearing.

Dorsett Kelly stated that as a resident, she is appreciative that this ordinance is moving forward.

Claude Kelly of Tanglewood Drive echoed his wife's words and thanked the Council, the GTPD for this historic event and stated that he appreciates what is being done for the township. He stated that he enjoys living in Gloucester Township. He again thanked everyone involved.

Mr. Jasper Lucas of Tanglewood Drive thanked Dorsett Kelly for all her hard work. He thanked Council, the Police Department and the Mayor for all that they did.

Dr. Robert DiLenge of 608 Tanglewood Drive thanked the Council personally and stated that he appreciates all that they did.

Mr. Mercado then read a GT E-Gov that was sent to the Township

The Noise Ordnance Proposed Update that was introduced to the council on February 27, 2017 should NOT BE PASSED. The Sound levels that are proposed are NOT realistic. As I have read the proposed ordinance that was posted in the Patch.

The Decibel levels that are proposed as written in the Patch are in no way realistic. If the ordinance was updated the Council meeting this evening would violate the inside decibel level allowed. I believe the inside noise level would close many businesses as well as would find almost all delivery vehicles, township trash / recycle / and outdoor maintenance groups being fined on a continual basis. Considering a normal person to person discussion can be around 60 decibels. I agree that noise levels are a concern for health and safety as well as having an enjoyable time around your residence. I believe the existing ordnance should be enforced. I also think that if there are to be adjustments made there should be

several field trips into schools, office buildings, auto repair shops, as well as to observe the noise levels produced by the trash trucks, Mr. Softy, a baseball field, football stadium, home dinner table, kitchen and living room. I do not think many of our own homes would fit the proposed restrictions.

Consider downloading as sound Application onto your cell phone and measure the sounds around you. According to the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, the maximum exposure time at 85 dBA is eight hours. At 110 dBA, the maximum exposure time is one minute and 29 seconds. If you must be exposed to noise, it is recommended that you limit the exposure time and/or wear hearing protection.

CALENDAR YEAR 2017 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A;4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the members of Township Council of the Township of Gloucester in the County of Camden finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2017 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the members of Township Council hereby determines that a 3.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$1,467,487.10 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the members of Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the members of Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, in the County of Camden, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2017 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Gloucester shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$1,712,068.29, and that the CY 2017 municipal budget for the Township of Gloucester be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

WHEREAS. The State Legislature has adopted Chapter 92 of the Laws of 2007 (N.J.S. 43:1 5C-1 et seq.) to create the "Defined Contribution Retirement Program" to provide retirement benefits to various county and municipal officials; and

WHEREAS. N.J.S.A. 43: 15C-2 requires the governing body of each county, municipality, and other local entity to adopt, as appropriate, either a resolution or ordinance to determine the positions that are substantially similar in nature to the advice and consent of the Senate for appointments by the Governor of the State, pursuant to guidelines or policy that shall be established by the Local Finance Board in the Department of Community Affairs, and for which officials appointed to such positions shall be eligible for and shall participate in the "Defined Contribution Retirement Program", subject to the provisions of law; and

WHEREAS. The Township Council of the Township of Gloucester has reviewed the guidelines issued by the Local Finance Board and desires to implement the "Defined Contribution Retirement Program."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester is hereby authorized to create the Defined Contribution Retirement Program to provide retirement benefits to various county and municipal officials:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden,

State of New Jersey that Chapter 5-5 entitled "Employee Benefits" be and is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 5-5G "Defined Contribution Retirement Program" is hereby

established as follows:

1. Pursuant to N.J. S. 43:1 5C-2, the following positions are deemed to be eligible for and shall participate in the Defined Contribution Retirement Program subject to the various exclusions and special circumstances describe in Chapter 92 and in LFN 2008-10 and Fact Sheet #80:

a. The Township Council Members if sworn in on or after July 1, 2007,

unless previously enrolled in PERS as an elected official prior to July 1, 2007, subject to the guidelines for exclusions set forth in N.J.S.A. 43:15C-2 et seq. and LFN 2008-10 and Fact Sheet #80.

b. Business Administrator, if appointed or promoted on or after July 1, 2007, unless previously enrolled in PERS prior to July 1, 2007, subject to the guidelines for exclusions set forth in N.J.S.A. 43:15C-2 et seq. and LFN 2008-10 and Fact Sheet #80.

c. Department Heads, if appointed or promoted by the governing body on or

- after July 1, 2007 unless previously enrolled in PERS prior to July 1, 2007, subject to the guidelines for exclusions set forth in N.J.S.A. 43:15C-2 et seq. and LFN 2008-10 and Fact Sheet #80.
- d. Municipal Court Judge, Municipal Prosecutor and Municipal Attorney if appointed on or after July 1, 2007, unless previously enrolled in PERS prior to July 1, 2007, subject to the guidelines for exclusions set forth in N.J.S.A.43:15C-2 et seq. and LFN 2008-10 and Fact Sheet #80, including but not limited to exclusions for individuals appointed through a professional services agreement.

e. Appointed members of local authority Board of Commissioners (subject to N.J.S.A. 40A:5A-1 et seq.)].

2. Individuals serving in the following positions are exempt from Defined Contribution Retirement Program membership, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 43:15C-2:

- a. Tax Collector;
- b. Chief Financial Officer;
- c. Construction Code Official;
- d. Qualified Purchasing Agent;
- e. Tax Assessor;
- f. Municipal Planner;

g. Registered Municipal Clerk;

h. Licensed Uniform Subcode Inspector;

i. Principal Public Works Manager.

3. If an individual is appointed to one of the positions listed in Section 1 and the individual is not serving in a position as described in Section 2 above, the Pension Certifying Officer may determine that the individual is not required to join the Defined Contribution Retirement Program if that individual:

a. Was an active participant in the Public Employee Retirement System prior to July 1, 2007, and continuously since that time; or

b. Has been appointed pursuant to a valid promotional process; or

c. Is appointed on a temporary, interim, or acting basis to a position requiring State certification as set forth in Section 2 herein, and is in pursuit of the required certification; or

d. Is subject to any of the guidelines for exclusions set forth by the Division of Pension and Benefits, in N.J.S.A. 43:15C-2 et seq. and LFN 2008-10 and Fact Sheet #80.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> This Ordinance shall be implemented, construed and subject to the aforesaid Chapter 92 of the Laws of 2007 (N.J.S.A. 43:15C-1 et seq.) as amended from time to time, and any regulations or guidance documents from the Local Finance Board or the Division of Pensions and Benefits.

SECTION 3. All ordinances and provisions thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Should any part or parts of this Ordinance be held to be invalid by any competent court of law, such invalidity shall only affect the part or parts held to be invalid and all other parts shall remain in effect.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> A copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Director of the Division of Pensions & Benefits of the New Jersey Department of the Treasury.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> This ordinance/resolution shall take effect upon its passage and publication as required by law.

SYSTEM AND THE ISSUANCE OF DEBT TO FINANCE THE COSTS OF SAID PROJECT

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, The Gloucester Township Municipal Utilities Authority ("Authority") has heretofore determined to undertake certain improvements to the Authority's System, as defined in the Service Contract between the Authority and Township of Gloucester, in the County of Camden, New Jersey ("Township"), dated as of October 24, 1983 ("Service Contract"), consisting of: (i) the acquisition of a new vactor truck for cleaning and jetting the sewer lines; (ii) the design, acquisition and implementation of a new communication system for the pump stations; and (iii) rehabilitation of certain portions of the System utilizing slip lining technologies (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to finance the costs of the Project through the issuance and sale of its revenue bonds in one (1) or more series in a total principal amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 ("Bonds") to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the Department of Environmental Protection; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 202 of the Service Contract, it is necessary for the Authority to obtain the consent of the Township to complete the Project and to issue the Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER, IN THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Township hereby consents to the completion of the Project by the Authority and the issuance by the Authority of the Bonds to permanently finance the costs of said Project.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Township Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to immediately forward to the Authority a certified copy of this resolution and such other certifications, documents, or opinions as may be reasonably requested by the Authority.

<u>Section 3</u>. All resolutions, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded and repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption this 13th day of March, 2017.
