ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 81 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER ENTITLED, "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that Chapter 81 of the Code of the Township of Gloucester be and is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 81-35B "Regulation for the Movement and the Parking of Traffic on Private Property Open to the Public to Which the Public is Invited (Retail Business)" be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Property:

FAVORITES AT GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP

1300 Blackwood-Clementon Road (C.R. 534)

Regulations:

- 1. General Parking:
 - A. All vehicles must park in designated areas and between the lines provided.
- B. Parking of vehicles, trailers, buses and recreational vehicles
 Vehicle Weight (GVW) is **prohibited at all times**except for deliveries.
- C. Parking of vehicles, boats or trailers with the intent to display for sale is prohibited at all times.
- Violators are subject to fine up \$1,000.00, subject to towing at owner's expense and/or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days or by a period of community service not to exceed ninety (90) days.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> All ordinances and provisions thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> If any section, subsection or part, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction, such section, subsection, part, clause or phrase shall be deemed to be severable from the remainder of the ordinance.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication as required by law.

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING **VARIOUS** IMPROVEMENTS TO THE STORMWATER DRAINAGE SYSTEM IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$750,000 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE GENERAL OBLIGATION **BONDS** OR ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$750,000; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purpose described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Township").

Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Township from all sources for the purpose stated in Section 7 hereof is \$750,000; and
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purpose stated in Section 7 hereof is \$750,000.

Section 3. The sum of \$750,000, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, is hereby appropriated for the purpose stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$750,000 to finance the costs of the purpose described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law. All or a portion of the bonds authorized to be issued hereunder may evidence one or more loans from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and/or the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust, under one or more Applications for Financial Assistance submitted by the Township to said entities ("Loan Application").

Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purpose described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$750,000 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$150,000.

<u>Section 7.</u> The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of said purpose; the amount of down payment for said purpose; the maximum amount obligations to be issued for said purpose and the period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

A. Various Drainage Improvements in and for the Township including, but not limited to, the Replacement of Stormwater Piping at Argyle Avenue, Sturbridge Drive, and Melvin Avenue; together with the acquisition of all materials and equipment and completion of all work necessary therefor or related thereto, all as more particularly described in the Loan Application on file in the Township Clerk's office.

<u>Section 8.</u> Monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of, obligations issued to finance the costs of improvements described in Section 7 above.

Section 9. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$750,000 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Township are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance and, to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the

Township shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

<u>Section 11.</u> The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.

Section 12. The Township hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceed of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code") for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Township prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 13. The Township hereby covenants as follows:

- (a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by the Bond Ordinance is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;
- (b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;
- (c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;
- (d) it shall timely file with the Ogden, Utah Service Center of the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and
- (e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.
- <u>Section 14.</u> The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Township may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.
- <u>Section 15.</u> All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Mr. Radisch stated that this is the highest surplus that the township has had in the last 20 years. He asked if the township would consider using surplus money to lower taxes. Mr. Cardis stated that wiping out surplus could lower the township's bond rating.

Mr. Heinbaugh also questioned the surplus account and also discussed banking CAP. Mr. Cardis explained the townships actions concerning this. Mr. Heinbaugh questioned the expenditures of the Office of Public Information, Township Engineer, Aid to Ambulance and the Prosecutor's salary. Mr. Heinbaugh also questioned the snow fund and the CDBG account.

Joanne Carr of Timberbirch asked what would have to happen for the taxes to go down. Mr. Cardis stated that it is very hard for taxes to go down as the expenses continue to go up.

There being no further comment, the public hearing was closed.

Robert Johnston of Lower Landing Road stated that he runs a program called Hooked on Fishing and he stated that the organizers will be interviewed sometime this week. Mr. Mercado thanked him for all the work he does for the youth of the township.
