WHEREAS, the township of Gloucester is committed to fostering increased adoption of electric vehicles and needed infrastructure in order to reduce global warming

pollution and improve air quality in the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Electrify New Jersey, in partnership with Jersey Renews, a state coalition promoting the transition to clean, renewable energy in New Jersey, and ChargeEVC, a diverse electric vehicle coalition, have developed a comprehensive framework to serve as a roadmap for creating a sustainable and growing EV market in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Electrify New Jersey roadmap includes recommended goals and policy actions designed to:

GT E-GOV ACCESS

Denise Coyne of Chews Landing Road asked the following question:

1. Did the Township of Gloucester adopt the New Jersey Abandoned Properties Act, NJSA 55:19 - 78 et seq? If so, was the ordinance amending the code of the Township regarding the NJ Abandoned Properties Rehabilitation Act which set forth the procedures for the Township to acquire abandoned properties added to the code of the Township? If so, when was it adopted/added? If it was adopted, who is the public officer charged with identifying abandoned properties? When was he/she assigned? Does the Township maintain an Abandoned Property List? Lastly, how many abandoned properties has the Township sold? Mr. Mercado stated Ordinance O-16-06 was adopted February 22, 2016. The Ordinance creating chapter 59B O-16-13 was adopted February 27, 2017. Mr. Carlamere stated that the maintenance of abandoned properties was awarded to ProChamps. Mr. Carlamere stated that the public officer is the Business Administrator and the Gloucester Township Housing Authority identifies the abandoned properties. Mr. Carlamere stated that the housing authority does not maintain a list of abandoned properties and has not yet identified any abandoned properties. Mr. Carlamere stated that the township has not sold any abandoned properties as of yet.

PUBLIC PORTION:

Mr. Mercado opened the public portion.

Ray Polidoro of Erial asked if Sara Bass Young could be kept in Council's prayers as she is recovering from multiple rib fractures. Ms. Bass asked Mr. Polidoro to ask Mayor and Council for a sign introducing Erial. In the past, the mayor has turned down Ms. Bass' request stating

that we are all one town, however Ms. Bass has seen similar signs all over town. Ms. Bass' also requested for the township to name Erial Proper, separating Erial from Sicklerville. Mr. Mercado stated that it is something council can look into.

Sam Sweet of Erial asked why there isn't a second reading of the SALT Ordinance on tonight's agenda, when the first reading was on the last meeting. Mr. Mercado stated that he did not want to put that item on the agenda, that he wished to give it some time.

Joanne Carr of Timerbirch stated that the Historical Committee had an open house and was blessed with a beautiful day. Ms. Carr invited everyone to come and see the new acquisitions at the tavern. The tavern is open first 2 Sundays in December. Ms. Carr stated that she attended the school board meeting and at the meeting it was said that a newly appointed member of the school board is not a resident of Gloucester Township. This individual owns a business in town, but does not live here. Ms. Carr asked what the school board can do about it and the attorney stated they can't do anything until he is sworn in. Mr. Mercado stated that the current Board of Education does not have authority to remove anyone. Reorganization takes place in January and this individual must pass a background check. As a body, can only remove members that miss 3 consecutive meetings. Ms. Carr asked if it is a requirement to live in the township to be on the school board. Mr. Mercado stated absolutely. Ms. Carr stated that it is an alleged article and whenever a resident comes to council about taxes, council tells resident to go to the school board because the school board takes more in taxes. Ms. Carr asked for a liaison to the school board and it hasn't happened. Ms. Carr asked how this newly elected person is going to be handling my tax money, she stated that it is only fair for voting residents of the township to know who they are voting for. Ms. Carr asked about having a meet and greet. If the school board doesn't make a venue available, can the township make a venue available. Mr. Mercado stated that he was at the meeting and that 2 years ago a group of people called GT United held a meet and greet with Peter Heignbaugh as the moderator, which is a conflict of interest. Ms. Carr stated that she ran a meet and greet with her women's club and someone came and assaulted a candidate and now the women of my club are intimidated and won't do another one.

Mr. Sweet stated that he would love to have Mr. Mercado moderate a meet and greet stating that Mr. Mercado can be unbiased when he wants to be, but at least a meet and greet would be done. Mr. Sweet stated that the state is addressing recreational marijuana use and wanted to know what Council's thoughts were. Mr. Owens stated that it was moved to the house, but that there is still work that needs to be done. Mr. Mercado stated that collectively, Council has not spoken about it

Mr. Polidoro reiterated what Ms. Carr stated about a liaison between council and the school board. Mr. Polidoro stated that the chief and deputy should have a very large say in the regulation of recreational use marijuana in Gloucester Township no matter what Trenton decides because there is a great deal of difference between medical use and recreational use. There being no further comment, the public portion was closed.

POLLING OF COUNCIL:

Mr. Hutchison stated that individuals who run for office, take abuse and the opposing team trashes those individuals in a public forum and website. Mr. Hutchison stated that he does not like hearing that behavior.

Mr. Owens thanked everyone for coming out tonight. Mr. Owens congratulated the Glendora Little League Kids. Mr. Owens thanked Chief Earle and the police department for keeping everyone safe during the storm. Mr. Owens wished everyone a Happy Hanukkah.

Mrs. Stubbs thanked everyone for coming out.

Mrs. Winters thanked everyone for coming out, congratulated the Glendora Little League, and wished Miss Sara well.

Mrs. Trotto congratulated the Glendora Boys Baseball Team. Mrs. Trotto wanted to give a shout out to the police with shopping at the Outlets this past weekend.

Mr. Mercado congratulated the Little League team and thanked everyone for coming out tonight. Mr. Mercado announced that Bethel Christian had its 15th annual Thanksgiving dinner and Chews United Methodist served Thanksgiving dinner on Thanksgiving. Mr. Mercado also announced that Saturday December 1 is the Blackwood Parade and the tree lighting ceremony is December 9 at 6:30.

Mr. Hutchison made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Mrs. Winters. Roll call vote: All in favor. Motion carried. 6-0.
